TITLE IX


Title IX of the Education Amendments Act became law in 1972. In 2022 we celebrated the 50th anniversary of this landmark legislation. Since 1972, girls' and women's sports have changed dramatically enabling millions of young girls and women equitable access to sports and other educational programs.

We have been very fortunate in Ipswich. With passage of Title IX legislation in 1972, the Ipswich High School Administration and School Committee were at the forefront in providing equitable programs for girls. Through their diligence and insight, uniforms, facilities, schedules, coaches' pay and supplies were equitably provided for all girls' programs at all levels.

Over the last 50 years, many girls have benefitted from Title IX in Ipswich. IHS female athletes have earned Division I and Division II athletic scholarships as well as participated at many Division III institutions. For those young women who did not further their athletic careers, participation in sports at the high school level helped support their future careers.

The Hall of Fame Committee supports the contributions of those female athletes both pre and post enactment of Title IX. Twelve women have been inducted for their pre-Title IX athletic contributions and 25 women have been inducted for their contributions since 1972. Of the eight inducted Ipswich High teams, four have been girls' teams.

The Ipswich Hall of Fame Committee honors the pre Title IX pioneers who established the foundation for all of those young women who follow in their footsteps. Although Title IX was enacted in 1972, it took a few years for implementation. We also honor those who will carry the mantle for future athletes. The Ipswich Hall of Fame will continue to support the tenants of Title IX.



R. BRUCE FRANKLIN, JR.
Football, Basketball, Baseball
1955-1959

Bruce began playing multiple sports as a youngster at Linebrook playground, only a bike ride from his Lord Square home. Kids would choose up sides for a baseball game on the softball diamond and to play “tackle” football. It was fun and dirty and without adult supervision!


As a recipient of nine varsity letters at Ipswich High playing three major sports at the time, Bruce’s commitment, passion and talent resulted in notable accomplishments of which he is extremely proud and thankful. On the football team, he was a two-way player and punter. He won the Samuel Hoffman Award in his senior year as the outstanding student athlete. He was humbled and surprised when he was named by the Boston Globe as an All-Scholastic receiver for the Small School – Class D Division.

During the 1958-1959 basketball season, the team won the Cape Ann League Championship. Bruce was Captain as well as the Most Valuable Player and was awarded the Richard Pickard Memorial Trophy. Twice, Bruce scored 30 or more points against league opponents.

Playing baseball primarily as a middle infielder, mostly shortstop, Bruce was elected Co-Captain in his junior year and Captain as a senior. The team was competitive, but not near championship level.

Throughout his high school career in Ipswich, Bruce was fortunate to be encouraged by three outstanding head coaches, each of whom are Ipswich Athletic Hall of Famers: Elliott Roundy, Bob McKenna and Bob Burke. After being selected as a National Honor Society student and graduating from IHS in 1959, Bruce attended Colorado College and was a member of Phi Delta Theta Fraternity. He earned a degree in Political Science and a ROTC commission as a Lieutenant in the US Army infantry.

Post high school sports included, up to his mid-sixties, adult town slow and fast pitch softball leagues, open gym basketball programs and long distance cycling. Doubles tennis and fitness center workouts are his current physical activities.



BEN ALHOWIK
Football, Basketball, Baseball
1959-1963

Ben Alhowik, like many of his childhood friends, had various athletic interests during his youth. Since Ipswich didn't have many organized youth athletic teams in the mid 1950's until high school, Ben's early athletic exploits were with a group of friends competing with each other.


Ben began his I.H.S. athletic pursuits as a freshman in 1959 by participating in cross country, basketball, club hockey and baseball.

As a sophomore, Ben had to make a winter sports decision between basketball and hockey since hockey became an official high school sport. Ben chose basketball and began the 1960-1961 season as a guard/forward on the JV team but was promoted to the varsity after one third of the season. He not only earned his varsity letter but was selected for the Cape Ann League All-Star team. Ben also played and received his varsity letter in baseball as a shortstop during his sophomore year.

Ben began his junior year as the starting fullback on the I.H.S. football team. Unfortunately, an injury ended his football season prematurely and delayed the start of his basketball season until mid-season. Nonetheless, Ben received his varsity letters in both football and basketball. In baseball, he earned his varsity letter and was selected for the Cape Ann League All-Star team as a shortstop.

During his senior year, Ben was named Co-Captain of the basketball team and was a key member of the 1963 I.H.S. "Cinderella Team". He was also a tri-winner of the I.H.S. Sportsmanship Trophy. Ben closed out his athletic career on a high note by being named Co-Captain of the baseball team and, once again, was selected to the Cape Ann League All-Star baseball team as a shortstop.

Ben graduated from St. Michael's College (Vermont) in 1967 and entered the US Army after graduation. He worked for Xerox for 34 years and retired in 2006. Ben and his wife Kathryn have been married for 53 years, and they raised three daughters Kimberly, Amybeth, and Julie in Ipswich.



JANET 'JAN' GERRY ELDIDGE
Field Hockey, Basketball, Softball
1960-1964

Jan Gerry Eldridge was an outstanding student athlete at Ipswich High School. She developed her passion for sports at an early age while tinkering on the family golf course. Jan was a proud member of the Class of 1964, where she was an exemplary three-sport varsity athlete playing field hockey, basketball and softball. Whether she was on the field or court, Jan led her teammates with a take charge mentality, playing both point guard and catcher. Jan was also a co-captain of the softball team. Known as "Jakie" by teammates, Jan led by example both on and off the field and court. She embodied the "Tiger Spirit".


In addition to her athletic career at Ipswich High, Jan loved the game of golf. She traveled throughout the USA playing many courses and attending many professional golf tournaments. Also an avid skier and member of the Ipswich High School Ski Club and Colby-Sawyer Ski Team, Jan skied the French Alps as well as many ski areas throughout New England. Jan also played many years in the Women's Intertown Softball League as a catcher.

After completing her competitive athletic career, Jan focused her energies on supporting both her daughter Tracy and granddaughter Katie's school activities and life events. Jan loved all things "orange and black". Whether she was participating, cheering from the sidelines or serving as a Tiger Booster, Jan was always proud of our Tiger athletes!




SANDRA CHAMBERLAIN MURRAY
Field Hockey, Basketball, Softball, Dory Racing
1960-1964

Unlike many of her fellow inductees, Sandy Chamberlain Murray did not hone her athletic skills on the playgrounds of Ipswich. She built her skill set on her own grassy backyard where her father erected a basketball hoop on a tree for her to practice. Sandy was a rare four sport varsity athlete at Ipswich High School. Field Hockey, basketball and softball were Sandy's traditional interscholastic sports. Her fourth sport was interscholastic Dory Racing. This was a co-ed varsity sport where the athletes spent many hours practicing on the Ipswich River behind Ipswich High School (now the Town Hall) or at Eagle Hill depending on the tides.

At an early age Sandy played basketball in the Ipswich Rec League on Saturday mornings. When she first began playing basketball in high school, the girls' game was quite different from today's game. Forwards were positioned on one half of the court (offense) and guards (defense) were positioned on the other half of the court. By the time Sandy was a senior at I.H.S., the game had advanced to allow a "rover" that would play the entire court. Sandy was a forward and averaged 10 ppg. The game evolved quickly after 1964, and players were in full court mode within a few years. As a four year varsity player on the softball team, Sandy compiled a .333 batting average while playing center field.

Sandy has always been a true Tiger sports fan as well as an outstanding athlete. At an early age she attended the high school football and basketball games both home and away rooting for the Tigers. Once Sandy's children were of age, she and her husband Rick became I.H.S. Boosters. In fact, Sandy and Rick can still be seen in the stands for Tiger games. Sandy also recently retired from the Ipswich Athletic Hall of Fame Committee where she assisted former outstanding Tiger athletes become inductees into the Hall of Fame.



SHAWN RYAN MCCARRON
Field Hockey, Basketball, Softball
1965-1969

Shawn Ryan McCarron honed her athletic skills on the playgrounds of Ipswich. She would often be seen participating in pick-up games in any sports that were available. She was a feisty athlete who possessed a passion for all sports.

Shawn played varsity field hockey, basketball and softball while at Ipswich High School. Shawn was a co-captain of the softball team while playing both short-stop and the outfield. She was also an aggressive point guard on the basketball team and forward on the field hockey team.

After graduation, Shawn traveled the country but eventually found her way back to New England where she rediscovered her passion for team sports and athletics in general. She became a certified soccer official, coached, and even became a sportswriter for the local paper. Shawn also played in an Over 40 Women's Indoor Soccer League.

Shawn understood the value of competition while recognizing how to use team sports as a tool to build confidence, strength and resilience from a loss. She was a supportive, creative and caring coach, finding the strengths of every player on the team and giving them the opportunity for success.

Shawn settled and coached in Georgetown where she raised four energetic and athletic children and instilled in them the value of sport! One of those athletic and energetic kids, Chelsea McCarron, became an Ipswich Athletic Hall of Fame 2023 Inductee as a member of the Girls' State Champion 4x400 Relay Team.



CHRISTOPHER D. LANDRUM

Basketball
1982-1984

Chris transferred into Ipswich High School for his junior year. Due to Massachusetts Interscholastic Athletic Association rules, he was ineligible to play for five months. On February 8, 1983, Chris played his first game against Rockport High, where he netted 17 points and 10 defensive rebounds – off the bench! During Chris’ senior year, he was a multi-talented ball player. His primary position was shooting guard; however, he also excelled in small forward and point guard duties – which culminated in many recognitions:

- Seven time Player of the Week
- The Robert Dudek MVP Award
- Cape Ann League Scoring Title
- All-Star Player - Cape Ann All League
- All Northeastern, Salem Evening, Beverly Times
- Career total points record – 418 points in his senior year (the 3 pt shot was not implemented until 1986).

Coach Markos stated, “He can rebound, shoot, and ball handle. He should be ready for anybody. He has enough talent and ability to play any of the five positions.”

Chris showed himself as an amazing team player and leader on the court, but it didn’t stop there. He has displayed the same work ethic in his life off the court. Chris attended Oklahoma Christian University and completed his degree in Bible Ministry & Education. He maintained his secular career to encourage youth as an elementary teacher, and providing transportation - while planting a new ministry in the Dayton area.

Chris has presented workshops & keynote addresses in the United States, Canada and Jamaica. A few of his most notable experiences were:

- Workshop facilitator at the Dayton Black Men’s Think Tank
- Workshop speaker for National Jail/Prison Ministry program
- Continued involvement with Montgomery County’s Adult Reentry program.

Every facet of Chris’ life has centered on being the best he can be for God, family, and community. He is a man who has taken the passion, drive and determination he displayed on the court into his daily life and pours it into everyone he meets to help them be better.



HUGH O'FLYNN
Football, Basketball, Track
1981-1985

Dr. Hugh O'Flynn is the oldest of four boys who were all outstanding three-sport athletes at Ipswich High School. His daughter, Hannah, was inducted into the Ipswich Hall of Fame in 2023.

Hugh excelled on the football field, and combined speed and size to dominate the trenches as an offensive guard and defensive end. Coach Welch described him as one of the best guards to don an Ipswich uniform, where he particularly enjoyed leading Joe Stasiuk around the corner on a “waggle” and any opportunity at a trap block. Hugh earned CAL All-League, Agganis All-Star, Salem News All-Star and Student Athlete Award, Boston Globe Division III All-Scholastic, National Football Foundation Student Athlete Award, and team Captain.


A CAL All-League track Captain (and recipient of Ken Spellman’s “Crane Beach Lifeguard Scholarship”), Hugh ran the 400m and threw the discus and javelin. He played forward on a CAL winning basketball team that went deep into the state tournament.

At Harvard Hugh was a four-year football linebacker and helped lead the 1987 Harvard team to an Ivy League championship. Hugh also ran track at Harvard, primarily the 400m and discus.

Hugh went to Columbia for medical school, did his residency in orthopedic surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery in New York and received a fellowship at Mass General.

Inspired by his experiences as a student athlete and excited to return to his hometown, Hugh became the Tiger team physician in 1998 and has been on the sidelines of innumerable athletic contests. He served as an Ipswich School Committee member for 19 years (consistently on the Athletic Sub Committee) where he was a great advocate for Ipswich student athletes.

Hugh married his high school sweetheart, Laura LaVallee, also an exceptional I.H.S. and college athlete. They have raised five daughters, each talented tri-sport athletes.



DREW WILE
Football, Hockey, Baseball
1989-1993

During his four years as a starter on the Varsity hockey team, Drew wasn't just a standout player; he was a force to be reckoned with. As a CAL All-Star in both his junior and senior seasons, he led his team in scoring while also racking up significant penalty minutes—a testament to his aggressive playstyle and commitment to defending his teammates. His skills stood out at the prestigious Hockey Night in Boston showcase, where he also earned an All-Star nod. He was named Captain for both his Junior and Senior years and was named MVP during his senior year.


Drew was also a standout player throughout his four years on the varsity baseball team. He earned honors as team MVP, and both a Salem News All-Star and a Cape Ann League All-Star during his junior and senior years. He was also given Honorable Mention recognition during his sophomore year. Drew's prowess as a left-handed pitcher was a key factor in his All-Star recognitions and a major asset to the team. Under his two-year leadership as Captain, the team made impressive runs to the state tournament during both his junior and senior years. In addition to his pitching, Drew was also a force at the plate. With a .445 batting average, he not only ranked among the top 10 hitters in the state but also provided critical offensive support that kept the team competitive. In his senior year, Drew was named the starting pitcher for the Cape Ann League All-Star game.

After an injury sidelined him during his junior football season, he worked hard to get back on the field. His senior year was a testament to that hard work, culminating in the unforgettable experience of winning the 1992 Super Bowl title. The euphoria of that championship game remains etched in his memory, a powerful reminder of the importance of perseverance. The experiences he had, from the first day at Camp Good News to the triumphant moment of lifting the Super Bowl trophy, shaped not only his athletic career but also his character.

Drew's journey didn't end with high school; it evolved into a remarkable career in sports. Drew continued his baseball path as a pitcher at Salem State University and earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Sports Management and Coaching.

Drew's love for hockey never waned. He is now in his 25th year of coaching hockey. During his tenure as a hockey coach, Drew has earned many accolades including nine Super Eight Championships!- He is currently on the coaching staff at Arlington HS .

Drew is married to his high school sweetheart Robbyn. The couple proudly reside with their 3 children Jack, Luke and Allie, in the home his grandfather built in 1950.



ELIZABETH "LIZ" GLAVIN
Softball, Indoor Track, Field Hockey
2007 - 2011

Liz Glavin was an outstanding three-sport athlete for the Ipswich Tigers. As a four-year starter for the softball team, Liz was named to the North Shore All-Decade Team for the 2010's, while also being a three-time Salem News All-Star and Boston Herald All-Scholastic. Her career highlights include 19 home runs, a remarkable .453 career batting average, 124 total hits, and an impressive best-season batting average of .584. Liz was recognized as North Shore's Most Powerful Slugger and earned the title of Team MVP in her senior year. The late legendary Coach Doug Woodworth said, "She had one of the best seasons of any player I've seen in my 25 years coaching". Woodworth further insisted "Liz would've hit 18-20 bombs if the Ipswich field had a fence" for her senior year alone.

In addition to her softball success, Liz excelled in field hockey and indoor track. Undefeated in the shot put, Liz was Cape Ann League Shot Put Champion and had a personal best throw of 36'8". As a CAL All-Star, Liz won Open Meet, was 2nd at D-2 states and placed 6th at the All-State meet. Coach Gardy O'Flynn called her "a tremendous all-around athlete." Liz was also a three-year starter in Field Hockey, CAL All-Star, team Captain and MVP her senior year.

Liz went on to continue her softball career at Wentworth Institute of Technology, where she set records for career-high batting average, slugging percentage, and most RBIs. Liz was the Conference Rookie of the Year and a four-time all-league player. Lastly, Liz picked up another sport at Wentworth in her graduate year for the women's lacrosse team where she started and chipped in 17 goals. Liz received both her bachelor's and master's degrees in architecture from Wentworth Institute of Technology.



GAIL IERARDI VAUGHN
Indoor/Outdoor Girls' Track Coach
1999-2005

Gail coached the Indoor/Outdoor Girls' Track Team from 1999-2005. She inherited a team comprised of both Ipswich and Georgetown girls in a MIAA Co-Op format. The team informally referred to themselves as the "Royal Tigers" as they ran under the Black and Orange colors of Ipswich High.

During her tenure, Gail earned Coach of the Year honors from the Boston Globe (2002) and CAL Coach of the Year honors (2001/2003). Her teams won three Class C state titles and one CAL title. In addition, Gail coached 16 individual Class C state champions as well as relay teams. She also coached three Boston Globe All-Scholastics, three Boston Herald All-Scholastics, a national relay team and one High School All-American Relay Team.

Gail graduated from Bishop Fenwick in 1984, where she was a Boston Globe Track All-Scholastic in the 600m. She went to Fitchburg State where she ran cross country, indoor, and outdoor track. Gail is an 8 time All American in the 800m and 400m. She received All ECAC, All New England and All Mass State accolades. Gail was an inaugural inductee into the Fitchburg State Hall of Fame and is a member of the Bishop Fenwick Hall of Fame. She holds 6 school records at Fitchburg. Gail became a marathon and ultra-marathon runner with a best time of 3:05 at the 1992 NYC Marathon. She has two children, Seth and Rachel, who spent a lot of time at the track while she coached. Gail became an RN and currently works at Brigham and Women's Faulkner Hospital.

FIRST GIRLS' TEAM OF ANY SPORT AT IHS
TO PARTICIPATE IN TOURNAMENT PLAY
PRE TITLE IX**

The 1972-73 Girls' Varsity Basketball Team at Ipswich High School was the first girls' team of any sport to qualify and participate in the equivalent of a Massachusetts basketball tournament. The Billerica Invitational Basketball Tournament was the Pre Title IX precursor to the MIAA State Tournament. This Tiger team had been 2-28 over the previous two seasons. This 1972-73 Tiger squad had only two seniors. The majority of the team was comprised of sophomores, promoted from the JV squad, and a few juniors. During the Pre Title IX era at Ipswich High School, no formal honors were awarded to players. The girls played each game clad in woolen, orange plaid kilts and orange turtle necks that they shared with the field hockey team. Games were played right after school or on Saturday mornings.

The Billerica Tournament was not divided into divisions by enrollment, so the Tigers had to compete against much larger schools. The Tiger record for their first time participation in the Billerica Tournament was a very respectable 2-1, with victories over Malden HS and Westford HS. The Tigers eventually lost to tournament champion Acton Boxboro.

The 1972-73 Tiger team built the foundation for the girls' basketball dynasty of the 70's, 80's and early 90's. Two future Ipswich Athletic Hall of Fame inductees, Holly Foster and Carol Graffum, played integral roles on this Tiger squad. The 1972-73 Girls' Varsity Basketball Team was comprised of dedicated, hardworking, scrappy players that epitomized "Tiger Pride" and "Tiger Spirit" in spite of the odds!

The 1969 Varsity Football Team outscored opponents 269-104 on the way to securing the Class D State Championship! The 69' Tiger Team ran a high-powered offense while shutting down opponents' scoring with a rigid defense. The Massachusetts all-state, all class, scoring leader, Pete Gorniewicz scored 130 points in 69'. Many on the 69' Tigers were also on the field for the 68' Tiger Class D champs as well. The 69' Tiger Team was led by Captain Carl Mattarocchia.

Several of the 69' Tigers gained accolades for their well-rounded athletic achievements both while playing at Ipswich High School and in college. Captain Carl Mattarocchia, Pete Gorniewicz, John 'Bubba' Galanis, Doug Woodworth, Dave Bialek and Jim LaRochelle became Ipswich Athletic Hall of Fame members.

The 1969 Varsity Football Team was coached by the legendary Hall of Fame coach, Jack Welch! He was assisted by legendary Hall of Fame coaches Art Carey, Walter Dembowski and Ken Spellman.







The *Ipswich High School Hall of Fame* has been established to honor athletes, coaches and persons who have made a substantial contribution to the Ipswich High School Athletic Program in order to recognize and preserve their accomplishments and memories.

ARTICLE IX

NOMINATION AND ELIGIBILITY

SECTION 1 — Membership in the Hall of Fame is open to those individuals who have distinguished themselves in the field of athletics, made a significant contribution while a student or coach at Ipswich High School, and who have displayed sportsmanship and have brought honor and distinction to Ipswich High School

SECTION 2 — ATHLETES: To be eligible the athlete shall have attended and participated at least two (2) years at Ipswich High School and have been part of a class that has graduated at least ten (10) years prior to the nomination for election. Consideration may also be given to outstanding performances during the nominees' college, amateur and professional athletic career.

SECTION 3 — COACHES: To be eligible, coaches shall meet the following minimum criteria: They must have coached for at least five (5) years at Ipswich High School and must have coached for at least ten (10) years in their sport. They must also be out of coaching for the sport nominated in for at least one (1) year prior to nomination.

SECTION 4 — MERITORIOUS SERVICE: To be eligible for selection for the Hall of fame for meritorious service, individuals must have made a significant contribution to Ipswich High School athletics.

ARTICLE VIII

NON-DISCRIMINATION

The Ipswich High School Hall of Fame Committee shall not discriminate in its policies, solicitations or selection on the basis of race, color, sex, religion, ethnicity, sexual orientation or national origin.
